




MOVE-IN DAY PACKING LIST

What to Bring and What Not to Bring



Knowing what to pack for college can be overwhelming. While everyone is different, use this packing list as a tool to get you started. It's best to avoid using lists provided by stores or posted online because they often contain prohibited items.

THE BASICS

- Clothing, pajamas, shoes, etc.*
- Winter coat, gloves, hat, etc.
- Bath & hand towels
- Business attire (for presentations, interviews, etc.)
- Rain/snow boots, umbrella, etc.
- Toiletries (soap, shampoo, etc.)
- Athletic wear, swimwear, etc.
- Shower tote/caddy
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.
- Bathrobe, shower shoes

* Bring a few items for each season but pack mostly in-season clothes. Semester breaks are the perfect opportunity to rotate things out as the weather changes helping you avoid over packing.



ACADEMIC SUPPLIES

- Backpack/book bag
- Sticky notes, notecards, etc.
- Flash drive
- Desk supplies (scissors, ruler, paperclips, eraser, etc.)
- Notebooks, binders, folders, etc.
- PC or laptop* with Ethernet/wireless cards
- Pens, pencils, highlighters
- Stapler with extra staples
- RJ45 Ethernet cord
- Bulletin board/dry-erase board

*The multiple computer labs on campus make personal computers convenient but not necessary.



IMPORTANT STUFF

- Government photo ID (driver's license, passport, etc.)
- Social Security Card (if you plan to work on campus)
- Personal property insurance*
- Banking information
- Health insurance cards
- Flashlight and batteries
- First aid kit, medicines, etc.

*The University is not responsible for personal property damaged due to loss, fire, theft, flooding or other reasons. We recommend purchasing renter's insurance if your family's insurance policy doesn't extend to residence hall living.



ROOM DECOR

- Bedspread & bed sheets*
- Mattress bag (encases entire mattress)
- Photos, decorations, etc.
- Pillow & pillowcase
- Area rugs
- Curtains, tension rod (shades/blinds provided)
- Throw pillows, blankets
- Full-length mirror
- Mattress pad/pillow topper

* Fairview Suites beds are **extra-long twin**. All other residence hall beds are **standard twin**.



TECH/ELECTRONICS

- Alarm clock
- TV with QAM tuner (for digital cable signal)
- Gaming system
- Floor/bedside/reading lamp
- Coaxial and HDMI cables
- Speakers/docking station/stereo
- Fan (window or table-top)
- DVD/Blu-ray player
- Headphones
- Surge protectors*

* Extension cords/power strips/outlet adapters **without** an internal safety circuit breaker are **prohibited** due to fire hazards.



HOME COMFORTS

- Refrigerator (up to 5-cubic feet capacity)*
- Single-cup coffee maker (items with exposed heating element prohibited)
- Can opener
- Microwave
- Mugs, cups, water bottles
- Plastic food storage bags, aluminum foil, etc.
- Plates, bowls, silverware
- Snacks

* Fairview Suites and North, Smith, and Woolridge Halls each has a communal kitchen with a full-size refrigerator for residents' use. Campus Village has a full-size refrigerator in each student apartment.



CLEAN/ORGANIZE

- Clothes hangers, drying rack
- Paper towels, tissues, etc.
- Cleaning supplies (disinfectant wipes, trash bags, etc.)
- Laundry supplies (bag/basket, detergent, stain remover, etc.)
- Metal/plastic trash can
- Air freshener
- Vacuum, broom, etc.
- Storage bins/organizers
- Sewing kit, safety pins, etc.
- Dish soap, sponge, etc.

PACKING TIPS FOR FAIRVIEW SUITES

Living in Fairview Suites means bringing everything a student living in a traditional hall does plus a few extras. Depending on if your living in a private suite or shared suite, here are some things you might want to bring:

Bathroom Tips* (Shared & Private Suites)

- Toilet paper**
- Bath rug/mat
- Hand soap & hand towel
- Toilet plunger
- Bathroom cleaning supplies

*A shower curtain liner and hooks are provided or residents may bring their own.

**Residents are responsible for providing their own toilet paper.

Living Area Tips (Private Suite)

How you set up this small, unfurnished area is up to you and your suitemate. Consider bringing a table & chairs for a private study space or a small sofa/futon and TV stand for an entertainment center. Slide a mini-fridge underneath the built-in countertop (34" high) and put a microwave on top to create a kitchenette. The built-in shelves offer extra storage space while the tile floor makes clean-up a breeze or bring an area rug.

Bedroom Tips (Shared & Private Suites)

Curtains - Window blinds are already installed but curtain rods are not. Tension rods are the only allowable curtain rod. Putting any holes in walls is prohibited.

Decorations - The walls in Fairview Suites are made with drywall. A poster hanging strip is installed in each bedroom for you to hang posters, photos, etc. Hanging items using anything other than the metal strip may result in wall damages and damage charges billed to the residents.

PACKING TIPS FOR CAMPUS VILLAGE

Living in Campus Village means bringing everything a student living in a traditional hall does but also furnishing a living area and kitchen. Here are some things you might want to bring:

Bathroom Tips* (Both Style Apartments)

- Toilet paper**
- Bath rug/mat
- Hand soap & hand towel
- Toilet plunger
- Bathroom cleaning supplies

*A shower curtain liner and hooks are provided.

**Residents are responsible for providing their own toilet paper.

Living Area Tips (Traditional Apartments)

A kitchen table and chairs is provided but the living area is unfurnished. Consider bringing a small sofa/futon along with a coffee table and entertainment center to round out your living area. A tile floor* runs throughout the kitchen and living area so you may want to add an area rug too.
*Bedrooms are carpeted.

Kitchen Tips* (Both Style Apartments)

- Pots and pans
- Microwave, coffee maker
- Dishes
- Glasses
- Silverware
- Cooking utensils

*A full-size refrigerator is provided in each apartment.

Window Curtain Tips (Both Style Apartments)

Window shades are already installed on each apartment window but curtain rods are not. Residents are prohibited from putting any holes in the walls so make sure your selected curtain rod will not cause any damage.

ADDITIONAL TIPS

About Computers

Information Technology manages all computing resources and technology on campus. To learn more, visit www.lockhaven.edu/it/ and click **Technology Information For Students** in the menu on the right. If you're thinking of purchasing a laptop, click **Student Technology Support Center** in the menu on the right for computer specifications.

About Posters

Chances are you'll want to hang posters, pictures, and other items on the walls of your room. **Be advised certain adhesives, mounting tabs, hooks, and other hanging devices may damage walls.** Only use adhesives/hanging devices that will not damage the wall and/or wall surface. Wall damages will be billed to residents upon move-out.

About Cell Phones

Residence hall rooms are not equipped with landline service. Verizon Wireless and AT&T are suggested for optimal cell phone reception.

Skype (www.skype.com) is suggested for those unable to bring a cell phone.

About Shipping

Packages/shipments sent to the University **must arrive after Move-In Days**. With this in mind, be sure to indicate the appropriate shipping date to your shipper. Visit www.lockhaven.edu/housing/mail.html for the correct mailing address format to use for on-campus students and other helpful information.

WHAT NOT TO BRING*

- Candles (burnt or unburnt), incense, potpourri pots, fireworks
- High wattage appliances (space heaters, air conditioners, etc.)
- Alcohol, empty alcohol bottles even if decoration, drugs, drug paraphernalia
- Coffee makers where the coffeepot sits on a hot plate/warmer
- Halogen lights
- Dartboards
- Toasters or toaster ovens
- Extension cords & power strips (only surge protected power strips allowed)
- Waterbeds
- Hot plates, electric skillets, or any other cooking appliance with an open or exposed heating element/surface
- Firearms, firearm replicas, BB/Airsoft guns, paintball guns, large knives, bow & arrows, & other weapons
- Amplified instruments
- Pets (except fish living in a 10-gallon or smaller aquarium)
